What goes into your Green Waste Cart?

The only items currently acceptable in the green waste cart are:

Grass clippings, leaves, weeds, flowers, plant cuttings, shrubs and tree limbs and branches less than 5 feet long. Please place all items loosely into the cart.

 Other materials such as dirt, rock, gravel, concrete, pet waste, fruits, vegetables, food waste and garbage are not acceptable.

Please **do not** overload your green waste cart. All green waste must fit inside of cart with the hinged lid closed.

Sorry, we can't collect green waste in cardboard boxes or plastic bags.

Green Waste Cart Collection Schedule

Green waste is collected every other week on your regular service day.

Residential Food Waste Collection Update

SSF Scavenger Company (SSFSC) is moving forward with its plans to install an Anaerobic Digestion (AD) facility at Blue Line Transfer in South San Francisco. The facility components are being fabricated, the permitting is in progress and the projected installation date is late fall of 2013. We anticipate

that food waste collection will begin in early 2014 once the Ad facility is installed and operational. The AD facility will be capable of processing all food waste and green waste from residential properties and converting it into compost. In addition, this biological process will produce a biogas which can be upgraded into a

usable fuel. The AD facility is expected to produce enough compressed natural gas (CNG) to fuel SSFSC's organic waste collection vehicles.

We are looking forward to providing you with progress updates and more detailed information about residential food waste collection in the coming months.
